Jamul Dulzura Planning Group Hears Public Comments on Proposed Sandmine at Cottonwood Golf Course

At the February 8, 2022 Planning Group meeting many community members voiced their opposition to the sandmine. Here are some of the comments/concerns:

- The Environmental report is flawed and incomplete. Does not address impacts to people, wildlife, air and roads.
- Health risks from Coccidiomycosis-Valley Fever, spores become airborne when sand is dug up. Spores get in lungs and bone marrow.
- Not consistent with the community plan or County General Plan
- Noise not addressed in EIR and near an elementary school (1200 feet away)
- Traffic not addressed on Hwy 94 or Jamul Drive, Steele Canyon Rd
- Threats to Sweetwater Reservoir/ 250,000 residents water source
- Emergency Egress plan not addressed/ this is wildfire area
- Hole will not be filled in after 12 years of mining
- Water use, pooling and ponding and toxic elements will be an attractive nuisance to young kids
- Air quality problems due to the dust and air pollution particularly individuals with asthma or emphysema, COPD
- Should not be in a residential area

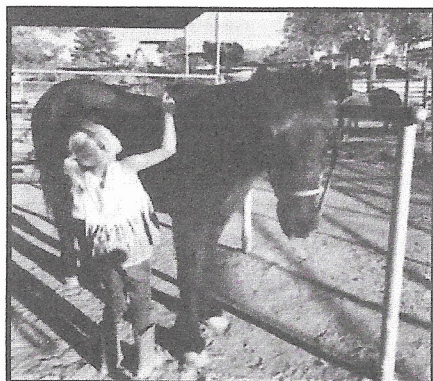

Jamul is Horse Country, and "All horses deserve, at least once in their lives, to be loved by a child". 21 years ago, Patty Hyslop and her sister Ladonna took that belief, passion and Patty's experience with 4-H Pony Club and created an environment that would foster a deep connection between children and a horse or pony with similar temperament & personality.

Hyslop Horse Haven has been a safe haven for neglected and forgotten horses, and often the children and students who come to learn at the ranch have found a safe haven as well. Students (of all ages) learn the FUNdamentals of horse care and riding through love and understanding of these incredibly beautiful animals.
